Department: Personal Development Year Group: 7 Half Term: 4

What is the point of the learning in this half term? Why are students learning it? How does it fit into the 7 Year journey? INTENT: This is a unit of work based upon the study of DIVERSITY and their awareness of diversity within modern British society. Students will explore a variety of the protected characteristics based on the Equality Act of 2010, such as: Disability Awareness, Different Lifestyles (including LGBTQ+), Multi-cultural UK and Employment Stereotypes. They will acquire knowledge of how all people should be treated, working on their own moral compass and further developing them into well-rounded British citizens. They will use this knowledge as a foundation for their 5 or 7 year school journey at The Garibaldi School, where Fundamental British Values are engendered throughout their school lives.

Within the Garibaldi KS3 learning journey, students will already have knowledge of the x4 Fundamental British Values (Individual Liberty, Democracy Respect and Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs, Rule of Law) from the half-term 2 Personal Development module on Fundamental British Values. As a result of students acquiring this previous knowledge, they will be able to observe and apply such knowledge to other key areas of the Personal Development curriculum, such as respecting others and consent, disability awareness and equality for all, as well as a multi-cultural and multi-faith Britain. These skills will lead directly to the KS3 journey of Diversity as students are required to have embedded knowledge of morals, respect, helping others and an awareness of a multi-cultural Britain, from both primary school education and their beginning journey at The garibaldi School.	Students will retain knowledge of Diversity, but will also develop and underpin their understanding in order to be able to identify the importance of embracing diversity within British society. These topics will be covered over a range of teaching styles, including group work, discussion-based tasks and questioning, as well as embracing key current events (Lego increasing disability representation and Stormzy addressing the need for diversity on and off the football pitch) to harness student learning. Students will retain knowledge whilst enhancing their ability to reflect on their own beliefs, opinions and why living in a diverse UK society brings so many positives to living in the UK.
